This course is designed to meet the needs of both pathologists and dermatologists with an interest in dermatopathology. Both newcomers to the field and those with considerable experience of skin pathology will find the course of value. In view of the new qualification of the Diploma in Dermatopathology offered by the Royal College of Pathologists, lecturers on the course will give particular attention to areas of relevance to those interested in obtaining this qualification.

The course, which is organised by Professor R M MacKie and Dr M Fallowfield, is divided into three sections—lecture discussions, individual microscopy sessions and projection sessions, at which material submitted by those attending the course will be demonstrated and discussed.

The syllabus covered includes the structure of normal skin, congenital skin disease, inflammatory dermatoses, granulomata and viral disease, cutaneous reticuloses, skin tumours, bullous diseases, connective tissue problems, medical mycology and oral medicine.

A feature of the course is a series of self-assessment slide sets which are made available daily and discussed at projection sessions. This is designed to appeal particularly to the more experienced dermatopathologists.

Accommodation will be available in a University Hall of Residence.
