Papers should be sent in duplicate to the Editors, *Journal of Clinical Pathology*, BMA House, Tavistock Square, London WC1H 9JR. They should be in double-spaced typewriting on one side of the paper only. The name of the author with initials (or distinguishing Christian name) should be followed by the name and address of the laboratory where the work was performed. A definition of the position held by each author should be stated in a covering letter to the Editor. All papers with joint authorship should be accompanied by the signatures of all the authors. Results should not be shown as both tables and graphs.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT *A stamped addressed postcard should be enclosed for return to the author as acknowledgment of receipt of the manuscript. Overseas authors should enclose international reply paid coupons.*

ILLUSTRATIONS Diagrams should be drawn in Indian ink on stout white paper. The legends for illustrations should be typed on a separate sheet. Photographs and photomicrographs should be on glossy paper, unmounted.

CHEMICAL FORMULAE should as far as possible be written in a single horizontal line.

ABBREVIATIONS In general, symbols and abbreviations should be those used by the *Biochemical Journal*.

SI UNITS The units in which the work was done should be cited first followed by traditional units or SI units in parentheses. Such conversion is the responsibility of the author. A conversion factor shall be given as a footnote to tables and in legends to figures.

ETHICS The critical assessment of papers submitted will include ethical considerations.

REFERENCES Number references consecutively in the order in which they are first mentioned in the text. Identify references in the text by arabic numerals (in parentheses). References cited only in tables or in legends to figures should be numbered in accordance with a sequence established by the first identification in the text of the particular table or illustration. The references should be given in the form used by *Index Medicus*:

Journal (List all authors when six or less; when seven or more, list only first three and add *et al.*)
