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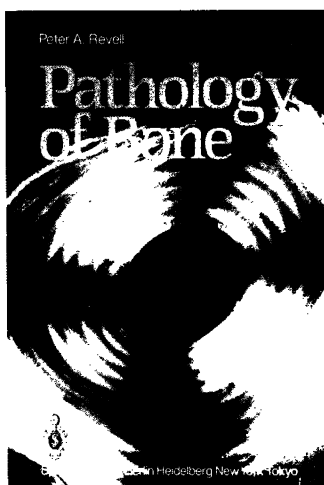

Pathology of the Pancreas

Pathology of the Pancreas results from the author's study throughout his professional career of this gland, its function, and the various diseases that affect it. The early chapters deal with the variations found in normal pancreas and give many examples of differing duct arrangements as demonstrated by post mortem pancreatography. The microscopic and ultramicroscopic appearances are also described. Several chapters are devoted to the involvement of the pancreas in systemic disorders such as cystic fibrosis, arterial disease and diabetes mellitus. Later chapters deal with the neoplasms of both the exocrine and endocrine components and with the associated syndromes. There is a review of the rare tumours. A chapter deals with the aetiology and pathology of non-infective acute pancreatitis and another discusses non-infective chronic pancreatitis; there is also a chapter on infective and parasitic lesions.

The text and illustrations are primarily designed to aid the diagnosis of neurosurgical biopsy specimens, but also cover many points of more academic interest; a comprehensive reference section is included for each tumour type.
